### From north to south SKI TOUR FROM ANDERMATT TO TICINO (CH) | 5 DAYS

Romans, knights and travellers of the Middle Ages have gritted their teeth on the crossing of the Alps. But for alpinists, the mountain massif is above all one thing: a huge playground. The Gotthard massif offers countless ski tours in winter. With the Mammut Alpine School you cross the impressive bulwark from north to south. Experience lonely ascents, hut romance, thrilling descents and a well-earned birra on the Piazza in Locarno.

### Program

Day 1	Welcome in Andermatt, handing over of the rental equipment and then with the gondola at approximately 3000 m to the Gemsstock. Here there are summits, couloirs and deep snow slopes as far as the eye can see. After an avalanche safety check, a racy first day in the direction of Guspis and a short ascent to the imposing rock needle, the Gloggentürmli. A long descent leads to the Gotthard pass and back to Andermatt in the Urseren valley. (Distance: 12.7 km, Duration: 3-4 hours, Ascent/ Descent: 620/2100 vertical meters)
Day 2	From Realp through the lonely Wittenwasseren valley to the Rotondo hut 2570 m, depending on conditions with a detour to one of the surrounding peaks. The Rotondo Hut stands exactly on the meteorological north-south border and with a little luck, exciting weather phenomena can be observed. (Distance: 8.2 km, Duration: 5-6 hours, Ascent/Descent: 1150/125 vertical meters)
Day 3	High alpine scenery over the Geren glacier to Passo di Rotondo. Then follows an impressive descent down into the Bedretto Valley directly to the terrace of the Ristorante All' Acqua, where you have earned a cool refreshment. (Distance: 8.5 km, Duration: 3-4 hours, Ascent/Descent: 500/1450 vertical meters)
Day 4	Freshly reinforced from breakfast, you will ascend at a comfortable pace to the Cristallina Hut. If you still have enough energy on the way, make a detour to the Cima di Lago, a summit surrounded by prominent Valais peaks, striking central Swiss summits and numerous Grisons mountains. To the south, the valleys lose themselves in the width of the Po Valley. At the Cristallina Hut you will notice that you have definitely arrived on the southern side of the Alps: there is lively conviviality and a Ticino Merlot is served for dinner. (Distance: 6.1 km, Duration 5-7 hours, Ascent/ Descent: 1300/30 vertical meters, with Cima di Lago 1590/320 vertical meters)
Day 5	The imposing Basòdino glacier is the silent witness of the last curves towards south. The powder snow gives way to the spring meadows of the Bavona Valley. By cable car and post bus we go to Locarno, where we enjoy a last refreshment on the piazza and take another turn through powdery slopes covered in deep snow. (Distance: 5.4 km, Duration: 2-3 hours, Ascent/Descent: 250/390 vertical meters)
