### Urner Haute Route

#### FROM ANDERMATT TO ENGELBERG (CH) | 5 DAYS

Discover one of the most beautiful and steepest Haute Routes in Switzerland. With sunny ascents on the south face and spectacular descents on the north, hopefully in fantastic powder snow. The historic ski tour between Andermatt and Engelberg passes through a particularly remote area. A sense of adventure accompanies this impressive experience as we make our way from hut to hut and summit to summit. This is an offer for skiers only.

Technique	<b>intermediate-demanding</b>  Piste: very confident and fast on skis; Powder snow: solid experiences in all types of snow; Terrain: mostly steep terrain, narrow couloirs; Alpine technique (ski touring) for climbing sections: solid touring experience as well as skilled handling of crampons and ice picks
Condition	<b>intermediate-demanding</b>  Duration from 7 to 9 hours, up to approx. 1,500 vertical meters, approx. 350 vertical meters per hour.

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### Program

- Day 1** In Andermatt, you will be welcomed by the mountain guide. After a short train ride to Realp, you will climb at a relaxed pace over the snowy Furka Pass to the historic Galenstock Hotel and via the Ochsenalp to the Albert–Heim Hut at 2,543 meters. There will also be time for an avalanche safety briefing along the way. (Distance: 5.1 km. Hiking time: 3.5 hours. Ascent: 1,070 vertical meters)
- Day 2** Starting directly from the hut, you will traverse toward Winterstock and climb to the Winterlu?cke. Depending on the conditions and physical fitness, we will continue to the Lochberg at 3,047 meters or go straight down to Lake Go?scheneralp. Whichever option we choose, you can look forward to your first fast-paced north face run. We will then make our way on skins through the Chelrenalptal valley up to the Chelrenalp Hut. (Distance: 13.2 km. Hiking time: 7.25 hours. Ascent: 1,500 vertical meters)
- Day 3** Leaving the canton of Uri via the Sustenlimi, 3,089 meters, we will enter the Bernese Oberland and come to the highest summit on this tour, the Sustenhorn at 3,502 meters. This will be followed by a long run down in an alpine atmosphere over the Stein Glacier at the Susten Pass to the Steinalp Lodge. (Distance: 11.8 km. Hiking time: 6.25 hours. Ascent: 1,200 vertical meters)
- Day 4** We will make our way through the Obertal valley, past the striking Fu?nffinger peaks, and climb up to the Uratstock at 2,911 meters. Back in Uri, we can then enjoy a great descent down to Kleinsustli. There is just one more counter climb to tackle before the well-earned reward of a cool drink on the terrace of the relaxed Sustli Hut. (Distance: 7 km. Hiking time: 5.45 hours. Ascent: 1,430 vertical meters)
- Day 5** We will make our way via the Sto?ssensattel and Firnalpfirn to climb the final summit of the tour, the Grassen at 2,964 meters, offering a magnificent view of the rugged walls of Titlis, Reissend Nollen and Wendensto?cke. The final run down is equally impressive: 1,800 vertical meters to the Herrenru?ti at Engelberg. A spectacular conclusion. (Distance: 10.3 km. Hiking time: 5.2 hours. Ascent: 730 vertical meters)
